SaskCulture Inc. is a community-based, volunteerdriven organization, which works with its membership and other community partners to build a culturally vibrant province, where all citizens can celebrate, value and participate in a rich, cultural life.

CULTURE IS...

Culture often refers to the particular values, beliefs, knowledge and traditions of a group of people. SaskCulture defines culture as 'a dynamic system of acquired elements, with values, assumptions, conventions, beliefs and rules through which members of a group relate to each other and the world'.

CULTURE INCLUDES...

ARTS

Art is the expression of inspiration and imagination, from individual to collective, from grassroots to professional and institutional. Art reflects our culture, embraces our past, provides a window to our future to examine ourselves and our experiences, and transmits humanity's knowledge of the world. The arts engage people as audience, creators or interpreters through access and education, and foster traditional to emerging art forms.

HERITAGE

Heritage is what we have received from the past. It shapes our present identity and provides insight for our future. Heritage includes a range of activities in the areas of stewardship, preservation, research, education and engagement. These activities exhibit a sensitivity to the indigenous natural environment; the impact of the interaction between human activity and natural environments; and differing perspectives regarding objects, ideas, places and traditions.

MULTICULTURALISM

Multiculturalism represents the openness to experiencing and celebrating cultural differences within the Canadian context. It is inclusive of all peoples and respectful of the rights of individuals and groups to maintain and practice their cultural heritage, distinctiveness, growth and evolution. Multiculturalism recognizes the richness and strength of ethnocultural diversity. It recognizes diversity and builds community by encouraging people to share, learn, appreciate, respect and accept.

CULTURAL INDUSTRIES

Cultural Industries constitutes the economy of the cultural sector, defined by a final product for consumption, derived from the creative sectors (consisting of individual creative and/or organizational creative), which is either non-reproducible and aimed at being consumed on the spot (a concert, art fair, exhibition) or aimed at reproduction, dissemination or export (book, film, sound recording, artwork), whether en masse or to a targeted niche, to achieve a value for a shared product or experience that results in, or involves, a financial or business transaction.

OUR MEMBERS...

SaskCulture and its over 140 member organizations, as well as individual members, represent the diversity of culture in Saskatchewan, coming from the areas of arts, heritage, multiculturalism and cultural industries.

MEMBER ORGANIZATIONS range from provincial cultural organizations and professional associations to locally-based cultural organizations. These organizations, along with their own memberships, help to nurture and support cultural development in Saskatchewan. Membership is open to organizations that have primarily cultural objectives, support the mandate of SaskCulture and want to have a voice in its direction.

INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS are Saskatchewan citizens who support the work of SaskCulture and stay connected to cultural issues through the cultural network.

OUR VOLUNTEERS...

SaskCulture is governed by a 14-member, elected Board of Directors, who oversees the direction of the organization. Elections are held each year at SaskCulture's Annual General Meeting to fill vacant positions.

Volunteers also hold important roles on SaskCulture's Funding Adjudication Juries, Creative Kids and other committees.

ABORIGINAL ARTS AND CULTURE LEADERSHIP FUND

Aims to increase capacity in Aboriginal communities through development of arts and cultural leadership opportunities.

Deadlines: April 15, October 15

CULTURE DAYS FUNDING ASSISTANCE

Designed to support Culture Days initiatives (activities, events and projects) that engage public participation and inspire future involvement in the cultural life of Saskatchewan communities.

Deadline: April 15

MÉTIS CULTURAL DEVELOPMENT FUND

Supports community-based cultural activities and initiatives that preserve and pass on the Métis culture and traditions.

Deadlines: April 30, October 31

MULTICULTURAL INITIATIVES FUND

Supports multicultural and ethno-cultural initiatives and activities that contribute to the advancement of multiculturalism in Saskatchewan.

Annual Funding Deadline: January 31.

Project Funding Deadline: March 31, September 30

MUNICIPAL CULTURAL ENGAGEMENT & PLANNING FUND

Supports municipalities' work towards cultural engagement and planning initiatives, such as cultural planning projects that explore and plan for the creative and cultural potential of a community. Deadline: February 15

MUSEUM GRANT PROGRAM

Supports and promotes the advancement of operational excellence in Saskatchewan museums. Deadline: November 30

ANNUAL GLOBAL FUNDING PROGRAM

Provides funding to support provincial cultural organizations that serve as a central resource for information, referrals and networking opportunities in a specific cultural discipline. Some organizations provide member funding programs.

ARTSSMARTS SASKATCHEWAN

Offers schools and their communities a chance to enhance arts-related activities that are linked to educational outcomes through partnerships with professional artists. There are now three components: ArtsSmarts, TreatySmarts and Artist in Residence.

CREATIVE PARTNERSHIPS - EXPLORE & CONNECT

Funds short-term projects that allow eligible applicants to engage in the arts through performances, workshops, exhibitions, commissions, etc., led by professional Saskatchewan artists or arts professionals.

CREATIVE PARTNERSHIPS - EXPLORE & DEVELOP

Funding assists eligible applicants to research, plan and develop an artist residency that may lead to an application for a Creative Partnerships - Artist in Residence project.

CREATIVE PARTNERSHIPS - ARTIST IN RESIDENCE

Funding to support an artist collaboration with a community, business or other institution.

PROFESSIONAL ARTS ORGANIZATIONS PROGRAM

Provides funding to support programs and services, governance, administration and operations costs of arts organizations in the province. Lottery funding goes to support the operations of art galleries and media arts programs.

SASKFESTIVALS GRANT PROGRAM

Provides funding towards administrative and artistic costs of Saskatchewan cultural festivals.

COMMUNITY GRANT PROGRAM

Supported through the Saskatchewan Lotteries
Trust Fund for Sport, Culture and Recreation, this
