## THE SYMBOL

LLAH symbol is composed of:

- A. Heart - representing love, compassion and becoming vulnerable enough to let the feelings held within flow outward. As Indigenous peoples we need to heal the hurts brought upon by the residential school system and the 60's scoop.
- B. The Healing Circle - promotes healing and support for those dealing with trauma and grief.
- C. Forget Me Not Flowers - symbolize true love and respect. The flowers represents a promise that we will always remember those we lost, and will keep them in our thoughts and hearts forever. Within the design the 4 flowers represents our commitment to Listen, Learn, Act and Honour.
- D. Morning Star - provides us guidance as we pray for a way to navigate through our trauma. The 4 points are also representative of the red, white, yellow and black peoples - it is a call for all peoples to come together as a community to heal and move forward as we collectively listen, learn, act and honour.
- E. The Rising Sun - symbolizes hope, a new day, and the opportunity to change.
