Deschambault Lake High School	Deschambault Lake	<i>Operation Health and Exercise</i> is a life-changing initiative that will give the youth in Deschambault Lake the opportunity to grow their own food and learn about the benefits that proper nutrition and exercise can bring as well as knowledge about their own past from Elders.	\$ 5,000.00
Grandmothers Bay Indian Reserve	La Ronge	<i>Traditional Culture Camp</i> includes a week-long Birch sap camp in spring, a Whitefish camp in summer, and a harvest culture camp in fall.	\$ 5,000.00
Kiskahikan School	Weyakwin	<i>Seasonal Culture Camps</i> consists of week-long seasonal culture camps for students offered by the school. The culture camps will include traditional skills such as fishing and trapping, leading to well-being outcomes.	\$ 5,000.00
La Ronge Arts Council Corp.	La Ronge	<i>Art by Annalisa at the Library</i> offers after-school art programming for children and teens by Annalisa, who will create a mural in the Children's section of the Library.	\$ 5,000.00

Reindeer Lake School	Southend	<i>Cultural Days</i> will have a Fish Station, Duck/Goose Station, Bannock Station, Meat Station, and an Arts & Craft station where students will learn how to set up and prepare all of the above.	\$ 5,000.00
Twin Lakes Community School Northern Lights School Division No. 113	Buffalo Narrows	<i>Culture 2024</i> will include workshops to make Octopus bags, ribbon book bags, moccasins, mitts, medicine bags/bracelets, and beaded 'every child matters' pins. These items will be displayed during our annual culture week in mid-March. Note, Ribbon skirts/shirts workshops are offered by various other community groups instead.	\$ 5,000.00
