Now, with her company, Inspired By Nature Culinary Consulting, Jenni create menus, recipes and immersive culinary experiences for businesses, schools and other

organizations. She has served as a councillor for the town of Birch Hills, was part of the Slow Food Saskatoon steering and fundraising committee for a decade, and was Vice President of Métis Local 126 from June 2020 to June 2022.

Jenni was Chef in Residence at the National Arts Centre in Ottawa, September to November 2022, and was installed as a fellow of the Royal Geographic Society of Canada in November 2023 for her work in Indigenous culinary. She has also been the Interim Executive Director of the Indigenous Culinary of Associated Nations since November 2022.

The rest of her experience has been gained in a hands-on manner, through mentors, and trial and error.
