Creighton Community School	Creighton	<i>Kodiak Arts and Culture</i> Through a partnership with the Flin Flon Aboriginal Friendship Centre and artist collective Norva, Creighton Community offers cultural teachings relevant to understanding of First Nations Culture through hand drum workshops, beading, leather work and Tipi teachings; also, we hope to add art courses, such as painting, copper work, clay, and print making, as well as photography groups, carving and a young artists group on a bi-monthly basis; finally, we promote inclusive programming for youth at risk where students will engage in a program of personal interest while receiving mentoring from the artist.	\$ 6,046.00
La Ronge Public Library	La Ronge	<i>After School Arts Club</i> will occur monthly, with two separate groups--one for children ages 5-12 and other for teens ages 13-17. Northern Village of Beauval	Beauval	<i>Métis Fiddle Instruction for Youth:</i> Two Île-à-la-Croix Youth who are active in playing the fiddle will instruct youth ages 7 to 19; our intention is to offer the Fiddle Program long term.	\$ 4,500.00
Senator Myles Venne School - Lac La Ronge Indian Band	Air Ronge/Lac La Ronge Indian Band	<i>Teen Writing Workshop</i> In partnership with Sage Hill Writing Experience, this will be an intensive writing program for youth ages 13-19 who will develop their writing skills in a variety of genres under the guidance of a professional writer assisted by a guest lecturer; on the final day, youth will perform a compilation of their best work for their friends, family and community.	\$ 7,311.56
Valley View Community School Student Leadership	Beauval	<i>Miyo Pimatsiwin-Living a Good Life:</i> This 2-week-long art workshop will give our youth early support network and an opportunity to discuss issues of relevance such as school, fears, doubts, problem solving issues, etc. This will be a way for the youth to look into repairing their relationships and helping them break down barriers within their families. The families will partake in different activities throughout the day and there will be an Elder and facilitator to guide these discussions. We truly believe that Art Therapy is a credible solution for suicide prevention.	\$ 5,500.00
